The Shellmont Inn

One of the most exciting things about the Shellmont Inn is its location. The Shellmont is on Piedmont Avenue, right in the heart of Midtown Atlanta! The original home was built in 1891 and is on the National Register of Historic Places. Innkeepers Ed and Debbie McCord have been the owners of this beautiful Atlanta Landmark since 1983.

Designed by famed Atlanta architect W.T. Downing, the Shellmont Inn is filled with fabulous architectural and interior details. The McCords have sensitively and lovingly restored the home's design elements, which include William Morris wallpaper, original fixtures and even a period 'Turkish Room'.

Guest rooms are filled with antiques, oriental rugs and period treatments, but all have private baths, queen-sized beds, complimentary Wi-Fi, flat screen TV's and more.

As for things to do while staying at Shellmont, the city of Atlanta lies at your disposal. Close by are the Fox Theatre, Civic Center, Georgia Aquarium, Turner Field, or any other of Atlanta's pleasures to enjoy. Of course, fabulous dining is available nearby, too, although you will want to enjoy breakfast right at the Shellmont Inn. Prices range from \$175 to \$350 a night, with five rooms in the inn

If the hustle and bustle of the city is not your dream of romance, then the delightful Chanticleer Inn Bed and Breakfast in the town of Lookout Mountain, Georgia may be just what you are looking for.

Though slightly larger than the average bed and breakfast – with eighteen rooms – the Chanticleer has all of the charm of a smaller B & B. The rooms are lovely, decorated with antiques, bright-colored chintz and toile, and artwork. All beds are queen or king (two rooms have two queens beds each) and each room has amenities ranging from gas and electric fireplaces to whirlpool baths and more. (All but two rooms have their own private patio.)

You can relax at the Chanticleer, either at their pool and sundeck, on the Bocce court, or just visiting their beautiful gardens and grounds. As for wonderful things to do nearby... these include Rock City Gardens, Ruby Falls and the Incline

as well as a carriage house to choose from.

Lake Allatoona Inn

If you or your sweetheart are fans of Civil War history, there is a Bed and Breakfast that can provide a romantic get-a-way full of both history and charm. It is the Lake Allatoona Inn, located just a few miles outside of Cartersville and at the entrance to the famous Allatoona Pass. The Lake Allatoona Inn is housed

in a Victorian mansion, built in 1893, that has been meticulously restored. The Inn currently offers three rooms (although two more are coming soon) each with a private bath.

As for something to do at the Lake Allatoona Inn, Lake Allatoona itself is just 300 feet away and guests can walk to the lake for swimming or the Allatoona Lake Marina, which offers a lakeside restaurant, beach, boat ramp, and dock. If you want to bring your own boat, there are places to park your boat trailer right on the property of the Inn.

Lake Allatoona Inn is also a farm, though, and offers overnight horse lodging, horse boarding and even hunt seat riding lessons. If you are an animal lover, the farm also houses a variety of farm animals on the property as well.

For the history buff, the famous Allatoona Pass is 'just across the road'. Built in the 1840's this is the spectacular railroad bed was cut through solid rock and was a marvel in its time. The 1864 battlefield of the famous Battle of Allatoona Pass is adjacent to the pass itself and it is an easy walk along two well-preserved earth forts with extensive undisturbed trenches there.
